### YEAR 11 PSYCHOLOGY

Would you push a man off the roof of a building? Would you carry a dead body and hide it in a box? Would you kick a man? Would you pretend to be a dead man?

At the conclusion of this unit of work on <u>"How are people influenced to behave in particular ways?</u>" students viewed "The Push" by Derren Brown. This is a real life experiment where they were testing to see if people would comply with instructions when pressure was placed on them. Students then summarised the experiment by summarising the method, creating a suitable hypothesis, IV and DV, considering ethics, results and generalisations. Finally they had to state whether or not they would have conformed/obeyed to the pressure.




Students are *very* excited to learn how to write an essay next week in response to the themes and characters in this book.

# The tides, they are a turning





Year 7 Science students are working independently to build their understanding of tides and the Earth.


