Please note: If you wish to use some of your School Saving Bonus (please see more information further in this letter) to purchase items on the booklist from Champion, we recommend that you do not place your order online until you receive your email in mid-November with the \$400 voucher information.

All Book Lists should be completed by Sunday 15 December 2024 to ensure your students will have all of their items for the first day of school in 2025.

You may select to have your Book Pack delivered to your home in January 2025 or you will be able to collect the pack from the school on Tuesday 28 January 2025 from 12 – 4 pm in the Stawell Secondary College Senior Hub via Patrick Street entrance

All students in Years 7 and 8 will study all subjects on the Book List.

If your student is in Years 9 - 12 please find enclosed a list of your student’s subjects to assist in your Book List selection.

Financial Support for Families

Stawell Secondary College understands that some families may experience financial difficulty and offers a range of support options, including:

- **School Saving Bonus**

The Victorian Government is making life that little bit easier for families by providing a one-off \$400 School Saving Bonus.

This support will help cover the cost of school uniforms, textbooks, and school activities like camps, excursions and sports.

The School Saving Bonus is in addition to existing and continuing means-tested supports for Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF) and the Affordable School Uniforms Program.

The School Saving Bonus will be provided to schools and families in Term 4, 2024.

You do not need to apply for the School Saving Bonus.

The Department of Education will email you in November 2024 with your \$400 School Saving Bonus. You will be able to decide how to best use the School Saving Bonus for your family's needs and allocate the \$400 in the online system.

PLEASE NOTE: If a family accidentally deletes the email, they must call the helpdesk (separate number will be provided) to have it resent.

The bonus can be used towards 2025 school costs, which may include:

- camps, trips, excursions and incursions
- swimming and sporting programs
- graduation
- school uniforms – from Fosters Mensland
- generic school uniform items such as school shoes – from State School Relief
- textbooks – from Champion Books.

Any amount that you choose to allocate to textbooks and uniforms will be valid until 30 June 2025. It will then transfer to your child's school account for future activities. Funds will roll over for use in future years if it is not all spent in 2025.

Please note: If you wish to use some of your School Saving Bonus to purchase items on the booklist from Champion, we recommend that you do not place your order online until you receive your email in November with the \$400 voucher information.

If you choose to use part of the School Saving Bonus to purchase your student's book pack from Champion, it is essential that you select at least one text book to make the book pack eligible for the bonus.

Families with more than one eligible child

Families who have more than one child at the same school can combine their School Saving Bonus payments to use on one child, or for a specific activity. So, for example, a family with 3 children who are all government school students would receive support to the value of \$1,200 and choose how they spend those funds. For example: if one of the students in the family has a number of expensive textbooks in VCE, some of the available funds can be used to purchase the entire booklist if you wish. The School Saving Bonus cannot be combined across different schools.

- **the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund**

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund will ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities.

CSEF will be provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to partially cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid concession card or are a temporary foster parent you may be eligible to for CSEF. Cards must be valid with Centrelink. Students can be aged from 6 to 18 years old. If a student is the holder of a Youth Allowance type card in their own name which is valid, the parent is eligible to apply for the CSEF.

The allowance will be paid to the school to use towards a child's expenses relating to camps, excursion or sporting activities.

The annual amount per student is \$250 for every secondary school student of eligible families, and payments will be made into the applicant's school account.

How to apply: On Tuesday 28 January 2025 contact the school office to obtain a CSEF Application Form or download from www.education.vic.gov.au/csef. A copy of your Centrelink Concession Card will be taken when you return the completed form to school. A reminder will be published in the school newsletter, Connections, early next year. Payment methods

There are a number of options available to parents to finance all costs associated with your student's education at Stawell Secondary College:

1. Payment in full. This payment can be by cash, cheque or EFTPOS for all debit and credit cards.
2. Parents can arrange regular direct deductions by contacting their bank or employer or using internet banking facilities. Parents choose the amount and the preferred regularity eg weekly, fortnightly or monthly. Parents may suspend or cancel these payments at any time. This process can commence any time after the enrolment form is submitted.

Families choosing this method of payment are not required to send individual payments for Extra-Curricular Items and Activities such as camps and sport events.

Aside from headscarves worn for cultural reasons, hats should not be worn inside. Hats are supplied to all Yr 7 and Yr 8 students and replacement hats are purchased from the school canteen.

FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the standard curriculum requirements in Victorian Curriculum F-10, VCE and VCAL.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.



PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:

Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum. - Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



SCHOOL PROCESSES
