Stawell Secondary College are thrilled to announce that Jade Smith, one of our dedicated (aspirational) and passionate (resilient) students, has been accepted into the prestigious Victorian Apprentice Jockey Program! After a year-long journey that included physical testing, interviews, and specialized training, Jade's dream of becoming a race rider is finally coming to fruition.

The road to success has not been easy. Jade participated in last year's program but did not make the cut. However, Jade's (resilience) perseverance and (aspiration) determination has paid off as she came back stronger than ever, earning a spot this year. The program is highly competitive and serves as a gateway to a career as a jockey, offering training and screening comparable to being drafted into the AFL.

Over the past year, Jade has undergone rigorous physical assessments, including VO2 max tests, body scans, strength and endurance challenges, and even an Echocardiograph (ECG) to ensure that only the most physically capable athletes move forward. Alongside these tests, Jade has participated in numerous interviews with racing officials and coaches to prove not only her physical fitness but also her passion for the sport and her integrity meets the strict ethical standards of Racing Victoria.

As part of her acceptance into the program, Jade will spend two days a month at the iconic Flemington racecourse, alongside specialized sessions at the Victorian Institute of Sport.

Throughout the program, she will work toward completing her Certificate III and IV in Race Riding, giving her the technical skills needed to thrive in this demanding field.

We couldn't be prouder of Jade's achievements and her relentless drive to pursue her dream. This next step is just the beginning of what promises to be an exciting career in racing.

Parent Teacher Student Interviews

Our first Parent – Student - Teacher Interviews will be held on Thursday 13 March after school and Friday 14 March 2025 in two sessions:

Thursday 13 March 4.00 pm - 6.30 pm Friday 14 March 10.00 am - 12.00 pm Friday 14 March 12.30 pm - 3.00 pm

Students are not required to attend normal timetable classes on Friday 14 March but would be expected to attend their interviews with their parent/guardian/carer.

This opportunity is provided to students and their parents, guardians or carers to discuss how the year has commenced and how the student has adapted to the subject. It gives everyone the chance to ask any questions they may have on the relevant subject. Our teachers see these interviews as invaluable, and we hope the students and families also consider these interviews as an important part of the child's education.

All sessions will be face to face.

Interviews for students in Years 7 - 10 will be for 5 minutes for each subject. Interviews for students in Years 11 and 12 will be held for 10 minutes for each subject.

Parents/Guardians/ Carers will be able to book interviews via the XUNO parent portal from Friday 21 February from 3.00 pm. Should you need assistance with your login to the parent portal, please phone our school office on 53581700 and our office staff will be able to assist you.

All bookings must be made by the close of business on Friday 7 March. This enables our dedicated staff to prepare the information relevant to your child prior to the interviews.

If you are not yet using XUNO, we strongly recommend that you follow the instructions in the Welcome Email you have received or call the school and ask for your login details. We recommend you set this up as soon you can. You are then able to use it for reporting your child's absence, view your child's timetable, view news items to assist you in all the events taking place at the school and so much more. This also gives you the ability to arrange your Parents Teacher Student interviews for some, or all, of your child's subjects.

If you do not have access to arrange your interviews, please do not hesitate to call our office staff on 5358 1700 and they will arrange your interviews with you.

Please note: the sessions will be held in the <u>Senior Hub</u>, which is the building on the corner of Patrick Street and Hastings Street.

ENGLISH AT STAWELL SECONDARY COLLEGE

Every class has been completing getting to know you activities. The Year 7's have borrowed books from the library for silent reading. They are now starting to explore autobiographies to link in with reading "Boy". The Year 8's have completed a pre-test and will be exploring graphic novels and narrative writing. The Year 9's have done a spelling test and will be looking at narratives and the Year 10's have borrowed out books from the library and will be starting argument analysis, looking at key issues in the media.

In VCE Year 11 English the students have been looking at film techniques for when they watch "The Dry" and in Year 12 English they are creating character charts from the book *Chronicles of a Death Foretold* by Gabriel García Márquez.

Silent reading (10 minutes at the start of every lesson) is a major focus of Years 7 - 9 and in Years 10 - 12 the students do 10 minutes of consistent silent writing.

The English staff look forward to having a great year with all the students at Stawell Secondary College.

SUBJECT CHANGES - YEAR 11 & 12 STUDENTS ONLY

In line with our Subject Change Policy, for the first two weeks of every semester, students are allowed to change elective subjects – pending parent/guardian approval and class sizes.

The Process:

 \cdot Students are encouraged to attend their timetabled classes in the first week (3-7 February) – (and determine if you actually want to change electives – as many discover they enjoy the subject if they give it a chance!)

• Second week (10-14 February) – if you still wish to move subjects and there is room in the alternative class and parents/ guardians have given permission – this move will be approved. Parent/guardian permission must be received to Cindy Bibby by 3pm on Friday 14th February.

To nominate to change subjects please message me via XUNO (preferably) or come and see me during the above dates. • I will communicate to students of the approved subject change via XUNO. You are not to move classes unless you have re-

ceived a message from me or your timetable has been updated - so keep checking XUNO. Therefore from 17th February no more subject changes will be approved and your classes will remain stable from then on.

Any students who feel their timetable is incorrect – as in missing/incorrect subjects please message me via XUNO or come and see me asap.

My Career Insights is a program for all Year 9 students in government secondary schools. This program will help your Year 9 child to:

• Learn about what skills and abilities they could bring to a job.

• Find out about what jobs match their abilities, interests and personality, and the subjects they need for those jobs.

As part of the program, your child will:

• Complete a series of online questions and quizzes (on the Morrisby Profile website) at school.

After the February session -

• Receive a Morrisby Profile Report showing the results from the questions and quizzes, and possible jobs that match their abilities, interests and personality.

Have a 30-minute meeting with a Morrisby-trained Career Practitioner, who will explain the report to your child. You can attend this meeting. Please tell the school if you need a telephone interpreting service

We look forward to celebrating together and making this Lunar New Year a memorable and meaningful experience for all!



SCHOOL SAVINBG BONUS

Have you accessed your \$400 School Saving Bonus for each child?

This once only support for families is very easy to use. This is your opportunity to purchase uniform items from Fosters Mensland or school books from Campion at no cost to you. Please do not hesitate to contact Marie McAloon, Business Manager, if you need any information or assistance.

Funds that have not been spent by 30 June will revert to your family account to be used for your child's camps or excursion. The opportunity to use the \$400 for uniform or book lists ends 30 June 2025. Funds will rollover for use in future years if not all spent in 2025.

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund will ensure that no student will miss the opportunity to join their peers for important, educational and fun activities.

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors, excursion encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works and sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are part of a healthy curriculum.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. Cards must be valid with Centrelink as of 19 January 2024. Students can be aged from 6 – 18 years old. If a student is the holder of a Youth Allowance type card in their own name that is valid, the parents are eligible to apply for the CSEF.

The annual amount per student will be \$250 for every secondary school student of eligible families. Payments will be made into the applicant's school account to use towards a child's expenses relating to camps, excursion or sporting activities.

REMINDER: ALL APPLICANTS ARE ASKED TO PROVIDE THE SCHOOL WITH A COPY OF THEIR CURRENT HEALTH CARE CARD.

How to apply: Contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from <u>www.education.vic.gov.au/csef</u>. A copy of your Centrelink Concession Card will be taken when you return the completed form to school. Applications need to be made by **Friday** 21 March 2025, however the sooner you apply the sooner you will receive the funds into your account.

CONVEYANCE ALLOWANCE 2025

A conveyance allowance may be paid to parents who drive their children more than 4.8km to the nearest pick up point of a free country bus service or their nearest school, where no bus service is available.

All Families need to lodge a new application.

Students who are attending Stawell Secondary College for the first time must meet the following guidelines. To be eligible for the Conveyance Allowance students must be:

1. Attending their nearest Government school.

2. Living further than 4.8km from either the school or the nearest pick up point of a free country bus.

Please contact the school office for an application form.

All eligible families must complete and return the form to the school by 28 February 2025.

YEAR 7 UNIFORM PACK (If you haven't already applied)

In 2025 every Year 7 government school student who was a recipient of CSEF in 2024 automatically qualifies to receive a uniform pack that is provided through State Schools' Relief. If your child is eligible and you are yet to apply for the package, you can apply for a CSEF Year 7 Uniform Pack by contacting Stawell Secondary College and completing the order form. We also ask that you arrange to have your child's foot measured at the school office.

You will receive a \$85 voucher for Foster's Mensland and a pair of school shoes.


